Your opportunity:

The MPH-Black Health (MP-HBH) is the first program of its kind in Canada. For this program, the Division of Social and Behavioural Health Sciences seeks an exceptional public health scholar with a PhD or an equivalent doctoral degree in a social or health science by the time of appointment or shortly thereafter, with a demonstrated record of excellence in research and teaching. We seek candidates whose scholarship encompasses Black health studies, critical race theory, anti-colonial (decolonial) studies, intersectional health experience including confronting anti-black racism, misogynoir, classism, heterosexism, ableism and/or religious/spiritual oppression, among other factors; racism and colonization as social determinants of health, racism within health-related institutions, organizations and professions and other public health related issues.

The incumbent will work closely with the MPH-BH Program Director to cultivate a collegial atmosphere within the program that encourages the intellectual and professional development of students in the program. As a member of the faculty, the incumbent is expected to teach and follow the approved syllabi for three courses within the program that will be taught during the winter 2024/25 academic year in person:

CHL 5821H African/Black Health II: Chronic Diseases and Black Health; Sexual and Reproductive Health; Black Health Across the Lifespan

CHL 5822H Decolonizing Theory and Methods in African/Black Health Research

CHL 5823H African/Black Practicum Preparation

Candidates must provide evidence of excellent teaching ability. Candidates must also provide evidence of a record of research excellence as demonstrated by publications in top ranked and field relevant journals, presentations at significant conferences, and awards and accolades. Candidates need to demonstrate, through their application materials, the ability to influence policy and practice through the production of scholarship and the effective translation of knowledge.

All qualified applicants are invited to apply, and we especially welcome applications from candidates who self-identify as Black, or racially visible (persons of colour). We seek candidates who value anti-racist and anti-oppression frameworks and whose research, teaching and service reflect our commitment to health equity and inclusion.



Applications should include:

- A letter of application summarizing your qualifications for this position.
- A curriculum vitae.
- A teaching dossier.
- A one-page statement of contributions to anti-racist and anti-oppression (equity and diversity) practice which might cover topics such as (but not limited to) research or teaching that incorporates a focus on Black and/or intentionally marginalized communities, the development of anti-oppression/inclusive pedagogies, or the mentoring of students from intentionally marginalized groups.
